Key Vocabulary

Classical music	This often means all Western art music from the Medieval era to the present. More specifically, it is music composed between c.1720 and 1840, e.g. the era of Mozart, Joseph Haydn, and the young Beethoven
Bass	In popular music, the bass part, which is called the "bassline", typically provides harmonic and rhythmic support to the band
Guitar	A musical instrument having a flat-backed rounded body that narrows in the middle, a long fretted neck, and usually six strings, played by strumming or plucking.
Keyboard	An electric instrument played like the piano. It has a range of pre-recorded sounds.
Melody	Another name for tune.
Percussion	A percussion instrument is a musical instrument that is sounded by being struck or scraped by a beater including attached or enclosed beaters or rattles.
Perform	Singing and playing instruments for others to hear.
Pitch	A musical dimension that describes the range of high and low sounds.
Pulse	The regular heartbeat of the music; its steady beat.
Rapping	A vocal technique in which the performer speaks rhythmically against a steady beat.
Rhythm	Long and short sounds or patterns that happen over the pulse.
Singers	A person who sings.
