Key Vocabulary

Christianity	The Christian faith centres on beliefs regarding the birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.
Easter	The principal festival of the Christian church, celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus Christ on the third day after his Crucifixion.
Eid-ul-Fitr	Eid al-Fitr commemorates the end of the fasting month of Ramadan.
Holy Week	The most sacred week in the Christian calendar. It begins on Palm Sunday and ends on Easter Sunday.
Matzot	A flat, usually brittle piece of unleavened bread, eaten especially during Passover.
Parable	A short story that teaches a moral or spiritual lesson especially : one of the stories told by Jesus Christ and recorded in the Bible.
Passover	Passover commemorates the Biblical story of Exodus — where God freed the Israelites from slavery in Egypt.
Qur'an	Muslim Holy book.
Ramadan	Observed by Muslims worldwide as a month of fasting (<i>sawm</i>), prayer, reflection and community.
Seder plate	The Passover Seder plate is a special plate containing symbolic foods eaten or displayed at the Passover Seder.
