



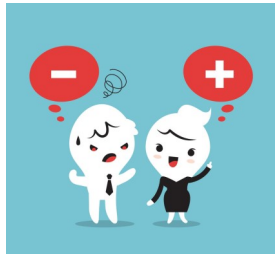
Mossfield Primary School Knowledge Organiser



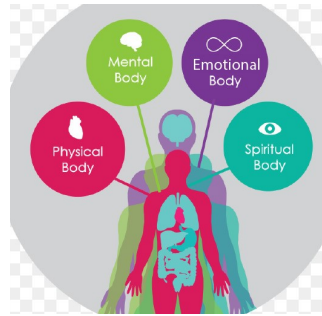

Key Learning

To be able to identify things that affect their behaviour in a positive way and things that affect their behaviour in a negative way.



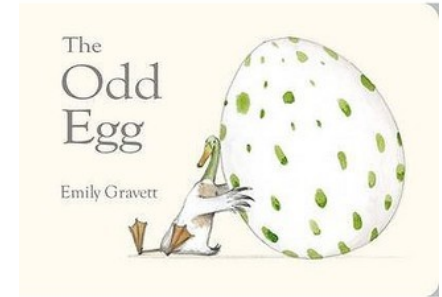
To understand the differences between being hurt physically and emotionally.



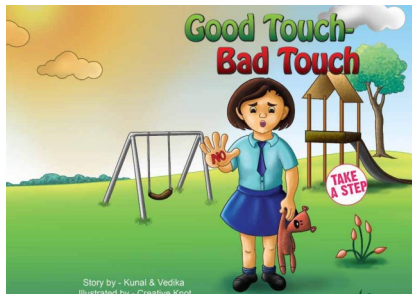
The importance of listening to each other and find ways to solve disagreements.



To read and discuss the text The Odd Egg to gain an understanding of what makes someone feel proud.



Discuss what appropriate and inappropriate touch means and identify who they can talk to if they are worried about inappropriate touch.



To be able to explain what teasing and bullying is and give examples of each. To describe simple strategies they can use if they witness bullying or hurtful behaviour.



Discuss whether certain scenarios involve fair or unfair decisions. Describe acts of kindness they have performed or witnessed.



To learn about sharing opinions and explaining viewpoints. To understand how to take part in a simple class debate.



Key Vocabulary

Behaviour	The typical actions of a person, animal, thing, or group, either in general or in certain situations.
Positive	A good or useful feature or quality.
Negative	Emphasizing the bad side of a person, situation, or thing.
Physically	Something that relates to the body as opposed to the mind.
Emotionally	A mixture of different feelings. Relates to the mind as opposed to the body.
Disagreements	To have different ideas or opinions.
Proud	Having a feeling of pleasure or satisfaction especially with a person's own achievements or with someone else's achievements.
Appropriate	Appropriate is defined as something that is right for the purpose.
Inappropriate	Not right or proper.
Bullying	One who is repeatedly cruel, insulting, or threatening to others who are weaker, smaller, or in some way vulnerable.
Teasing	A person who makes fun of people usually in a friendly way.
Debate	A discussion between two people or groups who disagree on an important subject.
