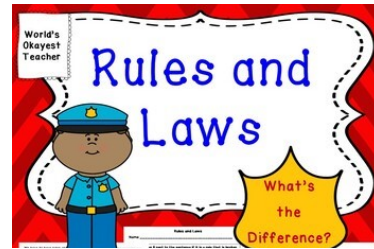
Year 3— **Living in The Wider World**— This unit teaches children about the importance of community and people's responsibilities within their groups and communities. It also teaches them about the importance of money, knowing where money comes from and why we need money. Through each unit the children also complete lessons from the KIVA (anti-bullying programme) and lessons from the No Outsiders in Our School programme which teaches children about the characteristics protected by the Equality Act.

Key Learning

To take part in debates on health and wellbeing issues that affect themselves and others.



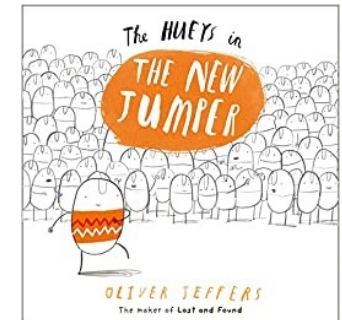
To give reasons for why rules and laws are made and why they are important.



To know that KIVA stands for a positive school environment and understand that every pupil has the right to a safe learning environment.



To understand why it's hard to be different through reading and discussing 'The Hueys in the New Jumper.'



To know that everyone has human rights and be able to identify some of their human rights and why they are important.



To know what is meant by emotions and understand where they come from and how to regulate their emotions.



To be able to explain that different cultures may have different practices and that sometimes these practices are against the law and against human rights.



Key Vocabulary

Health	The condition of being free from illness or disease.
Wellbeing	Well-being is the state of being healthy, safe, comfortable and happy
Debate	A discussion between two people or groups who disagree on an important subject.
Rules	Guidelines for how people should behave. They are based on ideas about what is right and wrong.
Laws	Laws are another word for rules. Families and schools have rules in place to keep everyone safe and to take care of people. Countries, states, and cities also have rules to protect people, and these rules are called laws.
KIVA	<i>KIVA is a anti-bullying programme taught in schools.</i>
Environment	All the physical surroundings on Earth are called the environment.
Human Rights	Human rights are the basic rights and freedoms that belong to every person in the world, from birth until death.
Emotions	A mixture of different feelings. Relates to the mind as opposed to the body.
Cultures	Culture is a word for the 'way of life' of groups of people, meaning the way they do things.
