To learn about the allocation of the Earth's resources.



To understand that finance plays an important part in people's lives.



To learn about money management and what the terms 'interest', 'loan' and 'debt' mean.



To learn about the skills that make someone enterprising.



# Key Vocabulary

Responsibilities	Being dependable, making good choices, and taking accountability for your actions.
Rights	Guidelines for how people should behave. They are based on ideas about what is right and wrong.
Duties	Something that a person should do because it is right or fair; responsibility.
Community Groups	A group of people living or working together in the same area.
Pressure Groups	An interest group organized to influence public and especially government policy.
Allocation	To divide and give out for a special reason or to particular people or things.
Resources	A Resource is something that can be used for a purpose.
Finance	Money available to a government, business, or individual.
Loan	Money given with the understanding that it will be paid back.
Debt	Debt is what someone owes to someone else.
Enterprising	Willing to do things that require energy and imagination.
