### Key Learning

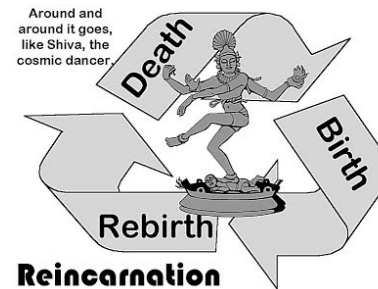
To consider questions such as 'what happens when we die?'

# Key Vocabulary

Barzakh	The place of waiting for Judgement Day in Islam.
Eulogy	A eulogy is a speech given by a friend or family member at a funeral or memorial service that pays tribute to the deceased. A eulogy provides those attending the funeral with stories and memories that made that person special to the speaker.
Funeral	A funeral is a gathering of friends and family of the dead person. They will mourn the dead person, meaning that they will feel and show sadness that the person has died, and also say thanks for the life the person had.
Heaven	A place where good people are believed in some religions to be rewarded with eternal life after death.
Judgement	In the Christian religion, The Day of Judgment is the day in the future when all people who are living or who have ever lived will be judged by God.
Karma	Good or bad luck, viewed as resulting from one's actions.
Reincarnation	The rebirth of a soul in another body.
Soul	It is the spirit and essence of a person. An example of your soul is the part of you that makes you who you are and that will live on after your death.
