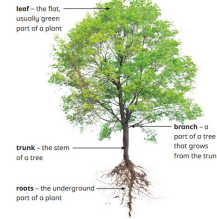

Key Vocabulary

flower	the part of a plant that is often brightly coloured
stem	the upright part of a plant, which is usually green
leaf	the flat, usually green part of a plant
petals	the outside parts of a flower
roots	the underground part of a plant
trunk	the stem of a tree
branch	a part of a tree that grows from the trunk
fruit	a part of a plant that contains seeds and can be eaten as food
wildflower	a plant that has not been chosen by humans to grow in their garden
daisy	a plant with a white and yellow flower
garden plant	a plant that has been chosen by humans to grow in their garden
sunflower	a plant with a large yellow flower
buttercup	a plant with a yellow, cup-shaped flower
dandelion	a plant with a large yellow flower and long leaves
deciduous tree	a type of tree that loses its leaves in autumn
sycamore	a deciduous tree with large, toothed leaves
horse chestnut	a deciduous tree with small leaflets on one stalk
oak	a deciduous tree with leaves that have a wavy edge
pine	an evergreen tree with needles
holly	an evergreen tree with sharp, spiked leaves
needles	hard, narrow leaves of some evergreen trees
